

Liouguei Dist.<

The renowned Laonong River flows through Liouguei District. There are six mass rocks in the river which early inhabitants thought resembled six turtles, thus the name "Liouguei" was derived. On both sides of the Laonong River, the Eighteen Arhats Mountain, comprising more than forty pointed, conical hills, is a must-visit attraction for many photography enthusiasts. Xinwei Forest Park is a popular spot for wedding photos. In the northern part of Liouguei District, there are Baolai and Bulao Hot Springs that are well-known in Taiwan.

Baolai Flower Park and Hot Springs

Liouguei District, Kaohsiung is famous for its hot springs and plum blossoms. The hot spring here is a sodium bicarbonate spring, which is colorless, odorless, and mild, and has a moisturizing effect on the skin, giving its name the "spring of beauty". In winter, dip your hands and feet in the hot springs to warm your body while enjoying the exquisite plum blossoms.



Maolin National Scenic Area

The Scenic Area spans Taoyuan, Liouguei, and Maolin Districts. It delves deep into the Central Mountain Range with high mountains, winding streams, waterfalls, hot springs, etc. It is also the traditional habitat of the Bunun and Rukai indigenous peoples, and boasts a globally renowned overwintering valley of purple crow butterflies.



Xinwei Forest Park

It's formerly a nursery mainly for growing seedlings, but there is no more nursery there. However, there is a poetic Mahogany Boulevard in the Park, which is ideal for romantic couples to have a stroll and take pictures.



Diasian Bridge

Siaolin Memorial Park

It was built in memory of the 462 villagers of Siaolin Village who were buried by debris in the Morakot Typhoon on the morning of Aug. 9, 2009. In the Park, 181 seedlings of Taiwan cherry, a native species of Taiwan, were planted, representing the 181 families that were lost. The memorial is constructed from rock pieces from Xiandu Mountain that flowed down during the typhoon.

Jiasian Fossil Museum

Geologically, Jiasian District is almost entirely made up of marine sedimentary rocks. The District is home to 9 major fossil areas, which led to the establishment of the Jiasian Fossil Museum. The exhibition items are primarily the ecological traces of fish and shellfish in Taiwan's inland sea. The Museum boasts a collection of more than 6,000 items, which are of significant academic and tourist value.

Q Liuyishan Trail

The mountain defines the border between Jiasian in Kaohsiung and Nanhua in Tainan, which was a popular hiking route during the Japanese colonial period. The expansive view is very suitable for watching sunsets. It has been selected as a national-level health trail by the Forestry Bureau.
