Meinong, a place traditionally inhabited by Hakka people, is located in the north of Kaohsiung City. Long ago, it was considered the 'Right Unit' of the Lioudui (six units which made up south Taiwan's Hakka militia). Hakka characteristics can be seen in Meinong's architecture, handicrafts, and specialty products. The warmth of its people is yet another attraction.





There are two main roads in downtown Meinong: Jhongshan Road (also called Kaohsiung Road 140), which runs east-west and connects to Taian Road to the east; and Jhongjheng Road, which goes north-south and links with Meising Road. The former can be used for trips into the mountains, the latter for visiting the town's various relics. Touring mountains and seeing relics are Meinong's two main travel themes.


At these altars, Hakka people worship their land gods, whom they call 'Bogong.' These shrines are also symbols of Hakka cultivation of the land, and represent communal living. In many villages, there is an altar at either end of the settlement, giving Meinong perhaps the highest density of land god altars in Taiwan.

Meinong's land god altars are unique in that they resemble tombs. The more complete ones are empty in the front and solid in the back, but most are only arrangements of egg-shaped formations. The earliest Kaiji land god altar is Meinong Kaiji Land God in the foothills of Ling Mountain. In all, four altars have been designed municipal relics by the city government. There is also a special land god altar behind the Jhong Family House. Established by the Jhong family, it uses a three-level pebble placement in a solid foundation and has a very elegant appearance.

Meinong has great ecological riches. May to July is the best time to view yellow butterflies. In July, the Yellow Butterfly Festival spreads the message of conservation and environmental protection. The festival features traditional Hakka rites, and the reciting of a butterfly address. Near the entrance to the butterfly valley, Shuangsi Tropical Viviparous Forest preserves rare trees transplanted from southeast Asia during the period of Japanese rule (1895-1945). These trees are extremely valuable for education, appreciation, and seed source preservation. Jhongjheng Lake is another attractive place where visitors can quietly contemplate the

Oil-paper umbrellas



In Hakka culture, umbrellas are auspicious and full of blessings. Meinong is Taiwan's best-known umbrella production center in Taiwan, and the workshops are mostly multi-generational enterprises. Umbrellas are painted not only with extracts from poems and calligraphy, but also images that reflect the beauty of Meinong. Innovative methods such as using blue dyes, cotton paper hand-tear painting, and paper-cutting have broadened the industry.

Oil-paper umbrellas are produced scrupulously and the handiwork is solid, so the umbrellas are very durable. The tung tree oil applied to make them waterproof changes color over time, adding a sense of nostalgia to these elegant keepsakes. Every part of the procedure, from making to painting them, is an expression of intricate art.

Meinong's rich humanity and culture is synonymous with Jhong Li-he (1915-1960), a local writer who created truly local Taiwanese literature. Taiwan's first

private literary-artist memorial hall was established to commemorate him. The hall has also collected manuscripts and works by other Taiwanese authors. For an overall understanding of Hakka culture, Meinong Hakka Culture Museum another must-see.

Humanities



Meinong has many temples in addition to land god altars. The larger ones include Chaoyuan Temple and Guangshan Temple; the latter used to be an important place for Confucian teaching in the Meinong area. Each year, on the ninth day of the first month on the lunar calendar, there used to be a "welcome sacred miracles and word-paper festival," but this event is now





Word-worshipping **Pavilions**



Hakka people have always respected and cherished paper and words, and wordworshipping pavilions reflect this attitude. The pavilions were established for the burning of paper in a ritual manner, and were usually located at academies, temples, and village street corners. Most pavilions have three levels. The second level is for burning paper, while the third level has altars with tablets dedicated to Cangjie, Confucius and Wenchang Dadi - all deities related success in literature and learning.

Word-worshipping pavilions in charitable halls are generally located in the front of the halls. with incense burners on the right and left. Meinong has four word-worshipping pavilions - in the north, south, east and west and among them, Minongjhuang Wordworshipping Pavilion has been designated a third-level relic. It features cut-and-paste floral decorations. Meinong residents pray here when their children are taking important exams, and the custom of burning joss paper on the first and fifteenth day of every lunar

month has been kept up.


The blue blouse, traditional apparel for Hakka women, is knee-length, wide in form, and has a large lapel on the right side. The sleeve is folded back into a "reverse sleeve pocket," and there are hem decorations at the lapel and the folded back sleeves. The material is primarily cotton, used for its solid texture and durability when repeatedly washed. Such garments symbolize the diligent and frugal spirit of Hakka women. Blue blouse master Mr. Sie Jing-lai, recognized by the government as a national treasure, continued sewing blouses by hand until he was 100 years old. His daughter-in-law has


